















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### Welcome back to Sheffield Hallam

# How we can help you with your reunion

Organising a reunion is a fantastic way to catch up with old friends, share stories and reminisce about all the good times you and your friends had here.

Reunions can also be a chance to talk to people working in a similar field to you and provide an opportunity to network and share expertise.

The Development and Alumni Relations Office is here to help. We can:

- Sontact Sheffield Hallam graduates on your behalf by sending them invitations or letters. Unfortunately we aren't able to give you alumni contact addresses due to data protection restrictions but we are happy to send them out on your behalf. Just tell us who you'd like to contact and send us an invitation or letter with your reply address and we'll take care of the mailing and postage costs (subject to numbers).
- Support you and your guests to fundraise for the Hallam Fund which supports the student and research community at Sheffield Hallam.
- Provide a list of a range of venues and facilities at Collegiate and City Campus.
- Set up an event booking page for you. SHU Store is a simple online booking site which will enable your guests to book online for your event.
- Promote your event by listing it on the alumni website and on social media.

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## How to organise a reunion

- Decide the format: Consider the style of the event you wish to hold; will it be a formal black tie dinner, or more informal and smaller scale?
- Get others involved: Other alumni can be a great help when you are organising a reunion they can help source venues and reach other alumni.
- Contact us: don't forget we are here to help.
- Set a date: Depending on the style of the event, you should start planning six months in advance, although for small informal events a shorter timeframe is normal. Diaries book up fast, so it's a good idea to give people as much notice as possible of your event. Decide what date to hold your event on; will you hold it to coincide with an anniversary (the date you graduated for instance) or a local event?
- Find a venue: What type of venue would suit the number and wishes of your guests? Think about places you may have visited together during your time at university. Most people will want to talk and catch up so a noisy environment may not be suitable. If you are interested in booking a venue on campus please let us know and we can support you with this.
- Guest list: Who would you like to invite to your reunion: will it be everyone from your year or a selected group of friends? Will you invite partners? We can find graduates from the same year as you and send emails or letters (subject to numbers) to them.
- Ask us to set up a Facebook Event social media is a great way to build excitement as well as keep everyone informed about your event.
- Invitations: Make sure you give your guests plenty of notice and provide an RSVP date. For larger, formal events we recommend that reunion organisers use our SHU Store booking site to manage responses.

- Tickets and advance booking: If you are prebooking a venue or ordering catering the costs can soon mount up. Will you ask guests to send money in advance or pay at the event? If you are paying for your venue, you may want to charge your guests for tickets to the event to ensure your costs are covered. Consider how much people will be willing to pay and ensure you budget accordingly.
- Decide if you want to support the Hallam Fund: You and your guests can have a transformational impact on Sheffield Hallam University by raising money for the Hallam Fund at your reunion. In doing so you will be supporting the next generation of students and enabling Hallam's researchers to tackle some of the biggest challenges society faces today. You can set a target for how much you'd like to raise and decide if you'd like the money to go a specific area of the Hallam Fund. ### After the event

After the event, we ask that you let us know who attended and circulate our Alumni Update Form to attendees for them to provide us with any updated contact details. This will help us ensure our records are up to date and that we can invite alumni to future events.

Where possible, we'd appreciate it if you could share your reunion photos and provide a brief account of the event for us to include in our past events and reunions section on our website.

We will follow up with you and other guests after the event to ask how the event went and what they would like to see from Sheffield Hallam in future.

### Ways to give back

#### Make a Class Gift

As a group you can set a target for how much you'd like to raise and encourage attendees to donate towards this. You will then be able to make the donation as a group towards the Hallam Fund. Raising a target of £10,000 would transform the life and university experience of a student through funding a three-year scholarship, alleviating them from the financial pressures they would have faced without your generous support.



A group of 1970s Urban Land Economics Alumni held a reunion to celebrate the 40th anniversary of their graduation ceremony. The attendees marked the occasion by generously donating £700 to Sheffield Hallam students who have come from a care background.

#### Hold an auction or raffle

Auctions and raffles can be a fun way of integrating fundraising into your reunion. Prizes can be sourced or donated in advance from attendees, friends and local businesses. An auction will need someone to act as an auctioneer, and money raised through bids can be donated to the Hallam Fund. A raffle can be promoted at the event, with prizes advertised and money from the ticket sales can go towards the Hallam Fund.

### Encourage attendees to become regular donors

Supporting the Hallam Fund with a regular gift allows us to plan for the future. You and your guests can give a student who's grown up in an atmosphere of uncertainty and insecurity the recognition and motivation to progress through their studies – if three attendees set up a regular gift for £15 a month, they will fund a life changing bursary for a current student.
