A self-guided tour



A walk around City Campus

Our City Campus is in the heart of Sheffield. This tour will give you a taste of what it has to offer. It takes around 45 minutes to an hour, depending on what you choose to explore.



1. Start your tour in the main entrance, Owen Building, Level 5.

Have a look around. You'll find the main reception, and the Student Services Centre, which provides advice and support in everything from disabled student support and finances to study skills and your wellbeing. Feel free to enter and pick up leaflets about what they offer. Further back into the building is the classroom-style Peak Lecture Theatre.

2. Leave the building through the double doors at the main entrance and you will find yourself in Hallam Square.



You will see the Careers and Employability Centre immediately on your right- this is where you can go for careers advice and support including help finding a part-time job. You can also see our accommodation office across Hallam Square on your left and the Millennium Gallery across the road. Walk up the steps on your right. (To avoid the steps turn left out of the building and then turn right around the edge of the square). Keeping to the road on your right, you will approach a ramp walkway to the Adsetts Centre.

3. Enter the Adsetts Centre and go straight ahead, past two lecture theatres on your left (if there are no lectures happening feel free to have a look inside).

4. Go through the left-hand door in front of you and take the lift or stairs down to Level 4. Go outside through the door and enter the Adsetts Centre main entrance on your left.

Explore – have a look around the Adsetts Centre (be aware that students are working). Our learning centres offer you an informal, social and creative place to study, with a mix



of silent and group work areas. They're open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year – so we're ready to work whenever you are. We're ranked 8th for satisfaction with learning resources with our students giving us a score of 90% (2017 National Student Survey).



5. Come back out of the Adsetts Centre entrance and turn left. Walk along the concourse and through the automatic doors. Take the right-hand set of doors ahead, signposted the Atrium. The Atrium is the large open space that joins several different buildings. As you walk through you'll see the Cutting Edge café above and to your left.



6. Walk the length of the walkway ahead on your right and then turn left to walk down the stairs to the bottom (to avoid the steps, go through the double doors on your right and take the lift down to Level 2. Come back through the double doors to find the bottom of the stairs).

7. Opposite the bottom of the stairs are double doors signposted Pennine Lecture Theatre.

Explore – go through the doors towards Pennine Lecture Theatre. With 450 seats, it's our largest lecture theatre. You'll see pictures on the walls of previous guest speakers. There may be a lecture on so please be quiet. But if there isn't feel free to open the door and have a look.

Once you've looked around, come back through the doors and into the Atrium. (In need of refreshments? You'll see Heartspace café ahead).

8. Exiting the doors for Pennine Lecture Theatre, turn right, passing the Student Finance Centre on your right. Go through two sets of double doors. Walk across the bridge and into the Hertha Ayrton STEM Centre, our £11m state of the art teaching and learning facility for science and engineering students. Walk down the ramp to get a glimpse of our chemistry labs on the left. Walk back up the ramp, turn left and go down the stairs.

You'll see various teaching buildings including Eric Mensforth Building on your left, and Sheaf Building, home to our engineering department, on your right.

9. Walk back up the stairs, across the bridge and into the Owen Building Level 2. Turn left through the doors and walk down the stairs to Level 1 (note that the Medical Centre can be found on this level) and outside onto Pond Street, turn left.

Explore – and walk a short way until you reach Sheffield Hallam Active on your left, opposite the bus station.



At Sheffield Hallam Active, you can enjoy a fantastic range of sport, health and fitness services at great prices. There's something to suit all tastes – whether you want to train in the gym, take part in classes, get involved in fun social sport sessions, or complete a coaching and officiating award course. Exit the gym, turn right.

10. Pass the Howard pub on your right and the train station and the Showroom cinema on your left.

Keep going until you reach our Students' Union, called The Hubs. You can't miss it – it's the building designed as four giant stainless steel drums.

Explore – to have a look around the Students' Union, enter through the main

doors. On your left is Bar Phoenix, and on your right is the Union shop. As one of our students you automatically become a member of our Students' Union. You'll have access to all the events, activities and services the Union has to offer. It's run by students for students, and there are lots of ways you can get involved.

You can choose from over 80 societies, in everything from film to baking. If you can't find the one you want, we'll help you start up your own.



You can help shape the direction of the Union, by voting in elections, contacting your Union reps, or even standing to become a rep yourself. You can represent your fellow students on a range of issues, including academic matters, student media and societies.

The Union also has its own free, confidential and independent advice centre. This can be found on the second floor where you can also find a common room. You can talk to them about anything and everything, whenever you need to.

11. As you leave the Students' Union, turn right and right again (by the side of The Hubs) at the crossroads continue up Charles Street (please note that the Cantor Building can be found to your left further along Arundel Street).



You'll see Charles Street Building on your left, this is home to the Sheffield Institute of Education and has specialist facilities for our teaching students. Enter the building via the main reception entrance and walk into the middle area (underneath the bridges). Leave Charles Street on to Arundel Gate and turn right. You will see Stoddart Building which is the base for Sheffield Business School. Enter the building, turn right and you will find the student help and information point - each faculty has one or more of these helpdesks in their buildings. Walk back to City Campus - finishing the tour in Hallam Square.

This tour doesn't visit all our City Campus buildings. The following buildings are also within walking distance if you wish to add them to your tour. You'll find them on the map.

Cantor Building – used for our computing, engineering and sciences students.



Sheffield Institute of Arts Building - home to Sheffield Institute of Arts in one of the city's most iconic buildings, the former Head Post Office.
